

won't be going alone. Mum will be joining me, and will be a welcome pair of extra hands for the conference, as well as good company. We will be flying out on Sunday 1st May, and arriving into Bucharest on Monday afternoon, before heading to Vâlcea. Prayerfully we will be able to get all the final preparations done during that week before we head to the conference centre, as well as getting over any jet lag.

The plan for after the conference is to travel to meet with other RWN workers who won't be able to attend the conference, before Mum and I then spend 10 days in Prague and Copenhagen. I have a feeling that downtime will be needed before we land back in Sydney on 3rd June.

Please pray with me for the next few months, and particularly that God will continue to raise up enough sponsors for our indigenous Rroma workers to come. Wouldn't it be amazing if we could fill all 100 spaces. My dream and prayer is to raise \$6,000 to cover the costs of 40 workers to attend for the whole week, as well as to help pay for some of our speakers' costs.

Of course, the next few months won't only be focused on the conference. There is also a lot to do in my Member Care role, as we prepare for what seems like half of our ITeams workers returning on Home Assignment in the second half of the year. They all have different needs as they come back, and our prayer is that their sending churches will get behind them as we empower them to do so. We are also continuing to work with the Cottrell family who have recently returned from 9 years service in the UK.

Preparing for our next ACCESS training, an orientation course for all new workers and staff joining International Teams, is also keeping me busy. And, I'm in the process of working with a young lady who will be coming from the USA, to join us as an intern in the National Office and with the Sydney Refugee Team, for twelve months.

For those who have journeyed with International Teams for a while now, you may recall that our mission statement was 'Helping churches help the poor and oppressed.' Whilst this still largely reflects what we do, we realised that this didn't quite give the whole picture. As such, our mission statement has been revised and is now: 'Encouraging, equipping and empowering churches to reach marginalised people with the Gospel.' I certainly feel that this encapsulates the Rroma ministry to a larger degree and I know others feel it encompasses their ministries more accurately also. Our Vision statement, which is used by International Teams globally, remains the same: 'Lives and communities transformed by the power of God'.

If you'd like to learn more about ITeams ministries, especially considering recent changes, why not join us at our Annual Dinner coming up on 12th March. Josh and I will be there and it would be great to see you there if you can make it.

Ministry aside, it's been a full but enjoyable start to the year. It's been great to spend some time with Kez, who was down for a few days, as well as Kaitlyn who I met when I

lived in Timisoara. Kaitlyn stayed with both Jen & Adi and Josh & I, over her three weeks in Sydney, and around our other commitments we managed to fit in some trips to Manly, the city, Taronga Zoo, Katoomba, Windsor and Kurrajong. 
With our routine having started for the year, Josh will start back at Uni next week (29th Feb):
