

Although wet and cold, after they had experienced some light snow the previous day, the serenity was glorious, and it was exciting to finally see my first wombats (alive) in the wild, including a mother and her joey. Back on the home front, we are about to face a busy season in the National Office. You may remember that back in January we had a young intern arrive from the USA. Well, being her Supervisor, it has been wonderful to have Oksana on board to help us develop a member care plan for our growing team of volunteers, and particularly with the Sydney Refugee (SRT) and StreetLight Teams. She has also been able to help with SRT's weekly visits, Food Bank and event organisation for things like the Refugee Family Weekend Away. Sadly, time is passing all too quickly, and whilst it's great that Oksana will be able to stay through till just after our Sydney Ride for Refugees, her contribution and fun personality will certainly be missed.

From Josh: "I have two exams next week to complete my last semester of uni lectures. This semester has included a lot of preparation for my research thesis next semester. In the second half of next semester I'll need to apply what I have researched by building a demonstration electronics circuit, and I'll be writing a report on all that I've found and designed. I'm quite excited to be graduating early next year!

My internship is progressing well and also nearing completion in July. Shortly I'll begin preparing reports to detail what I've learned and applied. The lift company has given me a wide variety of tasks to work on, giving well-rounded experience. I have also been offered a permanent position doing design and project management, through until we leave for Romania. This new position has lead me to resign from Bunnings after three years. While I am very thankful for the flexibility that Bunnings has offered during my uni studies, I am enjoying applying my engineering skills at the lift company."
