was just another wonderful reminder that God has each of His children on a unique yet special journey, that He has already planned in advance for us.

At the ITeams office, we have welcomed Deb Cheng into the administration role and Irene (one of our StreetLight volunteers) who now volunteers one day per week. This has certainly helped ease the load somewhat, and allowed the rest of us to focus more on our roles...

Phil, who serves in Mexico with his family, was on Home Assignment over Oct/Nov, and it was great to work through the debrief process with him, as all our people do after each term. He also spoke at our Prayer Breakfast, and it was great to hear some of what God is doing through their discipleship café ministry to university students.

I prepared our ACCESS training for five of our ITeams workers in November and it was encouraging to receive the positive feedback as they each engulfed the information. We covered topics like the history of International Teams, church and mission, and Crosscultural communication and worldview. It was also great to have John and Kathy, our workers in the Netherlands, run two of the training sessions via skype, on healthy living and healthy teams. On 31st October, rather than my previously planned attendance at the GLO conference, I took three of our ACCESS participants to Auburn, where we joined a Muslim Outreach training run by another organisation. It was a fantastic and timely opportunity, and I particularly found the life story of one new Christian brother inspiring.

In my member care role, I've also found joy in skyping and meeting with several church pastors, as they consider their role as sending churches. One church is currently preparing for their mission family to re-enter into Australia after 9 years in the UK, and another for the Home Assignment of their missionary. It is so important to ensure that each church sees their missionaries as an extension of their church family, and that they are playing their role to make sure they are spiritually and practically cared for. I was so pleased to come away from two recent meetings, knowing that those churches are eager to play such a part, and that we as the sending agency can help facilitate and equip them in their role.

The Rroma-Workers Network is now into its second year and I continue to receive emails each week with requests to join. The exciting news that we now have a place to host the conference was a huge relief for me, with much relying on that piece of the puzzle. I am continuing to work towards having registration forms available by 18th January and praying that this will all come together smoothly, including having all the forms translated into Romanian. Whilst I was hoping that the conference location would be closer to the middle of Romania, God has made a way for us to hold the conference near Lacul Surduc, about an hour's drive north-east of Timişoara. An even bigger blessing is that the cost to hire the centre includes accommodation, all food, shuttle from the closest train station (Lugoj) and conference facilities. Of course we have some additional costs such as translation equipment, music and printing etc, but we are off to a wonderful start.

At this stage, the plan is to be in Romania for about a week to ten days before the conference to get everything prepared, and then, after the conference, to stay on to visit several more workers in other parts of the country, who are unable to attend the conference themselves. I really appreciate your prayers for all God's plans to come together, and that I will be obedient in doing what He wants for this conference. I would also appreciate your prayers for all my skype conversations to go smoothly, and that He will provide be the right people to run each of the training workshops.

Thank you for continuing to walk with us, even though our journey has taken a different route to what we expected. I know it's often easier to support those who are physically ministering overseas, but will you please pray and consider financially supporting us whilst we are based in Australia. My ministry support remains at around 50% of my budget and whilst God continues to sustain us, it is important that we raise the necessary support, to ensure that I can continue to minister full time in my two roles.

May you and your family have a very blessed Christmas, and we pray that 2016 will provide many opportunities to trust and praise God as you see Him at work in your lives.
