hesitation as five of us ran away to The Entrance for two nights. The rest of the week followed with a Graduates' retreat, project fair (presentation for those of us who had completed projects that year), duties day (clean-up of the college), end of year dinner, and other happenings.

Graduation on 1st Dec saw many friends graduate as we heard how God was working in and leading each of our lives for His service. It was made more special as Mum and Dad were able to celebrate with me at the end of two years of hard work and certainly a memory I will now treasure.

An early morning start saw Shez and I enjoy a last breakfast together in Croydon before she and her parents left for the drive back to Toowoomba. I'm forever thankful to God for all my college friends and the way He has always blessed me with the right people in my life through each and every season.

After being back at Mum and Dad's for just one day, I then headed to Blackheath, where I was blessed with a house for a week. It was a well needed rest and prayer retreat as I considered the journey ahead.

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Kez arrived for the week, however, this turned out to be anything but our planned rest. On 16th Dec, we both joined our families for an early family Christmas and it was definitely a special time and the last time my whole family was to spend together. The next few days saw me enjoy a Christmas lunch with International Teams and Kez and I adventuring to 'Color-me-mine' to enjoy some ceramic painting.

On the 20th Dec, not long after we had all gone to bed, Mum, Kez and I were woken by the biggest scare of our lives. Though everything humanly possible was done, we were none-the-less devastated by Dad's sudden passing due to heart failure. Heart Disease is sadly something that is still in need of much more research, though organisations like The Heart Foundation are continuing to look into its causes and any possible preventions.

Though our family continues to grieve, God has certainly shown His mercies through this difficult time and even in the sequence of events leading up to Dad's death. As Pastor Marcus reminded us at the funeral, it's circumstances like this, when we walk through 'the valley of the shadow of death' (Psalm 23), that provides the opportunity to reflect on our own fragility and fleeting lives. It is an important reminder of our powerlessness against death and that our 'goodness' is irrelevant if we don't believe and follow the Good Shepherd, that is, Jesus. I'm so thankful that even during my time of weakness, God continues to be my strength and even when I can't pray, Jesus intercedes for me.

As I look at the way the last few months have evolved, I can see God's faithful hand preparing the way forward for the coming year. During my prayer retreat I felt very strongly the need to stay in Australia for 2013, and whilst I was confused as to why, I now have great peace about this decision after what has happened.


