But as I said, God has a way of making us turn our focus back to Him! This time of staying home and some days sleeping fifteen hours also brought me to rest in another way. I have been praying that God would reveal Himself to me and He has clarified, in more ways then one, His promises in Jeremiah 29:11...

"For I know the plans I have for you (Manda), plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you a hope and a future."

With this in mind, It is now that I would like to share with you what I believe the Lord has been showing me in His plans for me for the next few years...

After talking with various people, I have come to the decision to stay on in Timisoara and see out the <u>Summer camps and programs</u> including doing the Serbia English Youth Camp and Declar English Family Camp, which will take up the majority of July. This will also mean that I will be moving out of my current apartment about the end of June to help save on rent and bills that I would otherwise be wasting. And in case you are wondering, Anna will also be leaving, but in May.

Once all the camps are finished, I plan to be back in Timisoara for around two weeks before I will be saying farewell (at least for now) to what's been home for the past two and a bit years. <u>Leaving</u> on the 9th August, I will be meeting up with Anna in Warsaw and we will be doing a bit of travel together around Poland and the Czech Republic. From Prague I will fly to Belfast and stay with Jill, whilst also meeting up with some of the other Irish people who I have met during my time in Romania.

From Belfast I will fly to Edinburgh- where I will hire a car and have a few days driving around Scotland, staying with a few people along the way, before heading to Llandudno Wales to have a weeks debrief and processing with Wayne and Kim Platt, a couple who are also with International Teams. Making my way back toward London, I am planning to head home to Australia around mid-late September.

I am currently in the process of trying to work through applications etc, but, once home, I am planning to <u>study</u> full-time at the Sydney Missionary and Bible College over 2011-12. This will also include living on campus.

Only the Lord knows what is install beyond this time, but at this stage my heart is open to go where He leads me, whether this be returning to overseas mission and Romania or elsewhere, or in a completely different field. I only pray that I would be sensitive to His calling through it all!

I have written this newsletter to you, my supporters and friends, in the hope that you would join me in praying that the decisions I make now would help equip me for what the Lord has instore for me in the future. May His will be done!
