It can easily become overwhelming as I organise the topics and speakers for the workshops, registrations and sponsorships, translators, program and everything else. have received from colleagues and workers in Romania. And, praise God that the conference centre is booked.

We will be heading over to Romania at the end of May, with the conference being from 4-8 June. Josh and Mum will be joining me with the primary role of looking after Isla, and helping out with conference organisation where possible.

This past month I've also had conversations with a family and another lady in Australia, who are both exploring working with Rroma in Eastern Europe. They both contacted me after hearing about the conference, and are now making plans to join us in June. It is exciting to watch God bring who he wants to be part of this conference, and I only pray that news will continue to spread, especially amongst workers throughout Romania.

What is really needed now is to raise enough sponsorships for workers to attend who are otherwise are unable to. In particular, it would be a huge blessing to have workers who are Rroma themselves to be able to attend, as they desire and dream for their communities to know Christ. It is a privilege to invest in their lives, to enable them to become more effective in their own faith and ministries, and this is where you can be a blessing also. We currently have 13 workers sponsored, with a goal towards having 40 Rroma-Workers attend.

Can you help? Just AUD\$165 (EUR110) will provide for the registration, accommodation and all resources for one RWN worker to attend for the whole five days. If God is putting this on your heart, please go to www.iteams.org.au/rwn and select how many workers you want to support, or the amount of your one-off gift. The sooner we have sponsorships, the sooner we can invite workers to attend.

As Josh and I continue towards our move to Romania, our prayer is that God will raise up the remaining financial support we need before we can book our tickets. Our support currently sits at 55%, though we now need to consider Isla in this budget. Prayerfully, our upcoming trip to Romania in June will allow Josh and I to begin scoping out what we will need going forwards and also to finalise our budget.

Thank you again for your ongoing partnership, love and prayers. Whilst the next few months are quite busy, we would still love to share with any churches and small groups interested in our ministry and the Rroma-Workers Network. Can you help us open some doors of opportunity to come and share either in Sydney or even interstate?
