During these visits we saw the Vivid light show, drove out to Windsor and Wiseman's Ferry and visited friends at SMBC.



just how important it is to set an example for those who watch our every move (1 Timothy 4:12). I especially enjoyed meeting up with 'Miss' Jenny, who was my leader when I was in Cadets at Girls' Brigade, and reflect on how much I looked up to the adults in my life as a kid and what that means now in reverse.

And six months on, our family were finally able to go and visit the Northern Suburbs Crematorium to see where Dad's ashes have been laid. Being a man who loved the outdoors, we chose to place them in the newly established 'Billabong' area, with the plaque placed on a rock and situated next to a grevillea tree. It is just right!

So if I haven't exhausted you with all that, the next month is going to be just as packed. I still have a few things to prepare, like budget information and packing, but I am making progress with all the things I need to get done before I fly to Romania on 2nd August.

Five flights and 43 hours of travel will see me land in Timişoara, Romania to spend three days visiting friends and those I ministered to there. I will then take a six hour train ride to Vâlcea where I will spread myself between a kids program (VBS), Rroma camp and working out budgets and living arrangements for moving there next year. On 18th, I will fly to Germany to be part of the I.Teams Europe conference. I am very much looking forward to seeing all those who I already know and meeting those who I will network with in the future.

Please be with me in prayer through the month ahead, that I will accomplish all I need to and that God will bless the time I have to make this vision trip as beneficial as possible. I am certainly looking forward to sharing what God does with this trip and being able to make more concrete plans for my move to Râmnicu Vâlcea.

Knowing I am still a long way off from the 90% of pledged funds needed to book my tickets, please continue to pray that God will raise up His team to partner with me. Amidst everything else, I am slowly creating a website, which I hope to have up and running by the end of the year. Its aim is to allow everyone to access my newsletters, support details and other useful information such as my prayer support calendar.

While sometimes this journey has felt daunting, especially as I continue to face various life changing decisions, God continues to reassure me that it is Him who steps out before me and determines my steps (Proverbs 16:9) even when I cannot always see where the future will lead. I am just thankful that my future, both here on earth and home in heaven, is assured. I can only pray for those who don't have this hope and faith, that they will find purpose in life through Jesus' interceding actions, before it is too late.
