Thankfully, the long winter has now passed, and we are amidst the April Spring rains, with some beautiful days in between. Hosting an 'Australian Cultural Afternoon' for the children at Potter's House. A Valentine's Day party for the girls from both the Girls' House and Potter's House, showing them the love they deserve.

From the 19th to 22nd March- Anna, Jen, Lynn, Kelly, Jill and I travelled over to Barcelona, Spain for a girly weekend for my 25th Birthday Bash. It was a special

> time away and nice to be able to spend some time together before we all start going our separate ways once more.

We Celebrated with two of the street youth, **Dani and Cristina**, as they were married on 27th March. A special day for them both as everything was provided, which

would otherwise have been impossible.

From 29th-31st March, with the help of a German team, the Potter's children visited and gave an Easter program to a local nursing home, the boys juvenile prison in Buzias, and to the children in Pietroasa Village. The children performed pantomimes, sang and the message of Easter was given. It was encouraging to see the Lord bring this all together and to see the openness of those who heard the good news about Jesus.

And in case you're wondering- the Easter craft I was preparing went really well. So thank you to those who played a part in the preparations.

am excited to look back and see how all the children have grown and changed, and I only pray that this will continue, even after I leave. During a time of prayer at my Potter's House birthday party, I was touched as once of the boys prayed "God, if you need to send Manda to a place where children need her more then we do, that's ok, but if not, please bring her back to us." God is at work!!

Easter Monday saw Kathleen, Stuart and Dorothy (a British couple) and I, drive about nine hours south-west to the town of Leskovac, Serbia. Warmly welcomed as if they had known us for years, we were involved in a four-day English Camp for the Roma (Gypsy) youth. About 60 youth, aging from around 10 to 24, came with hearts open to receive the word of God and to learn English. A team of seven Slovenes also made the long trip over for the camp. It was a real privilege to serve alongside them-one, because some of them knew Serbian and could communicate with the youth and two, because they all spoke great English and could communicate with us. It really was a fantastic camp with every opportunity to share God's love with the Roma Youth and I can't wait to hear about the ways God will now grow those nine new Christians as well as those who recommitted their lives to Christ.

I am now finding myself sorting through documents and items I have gathered over the passed (almost) two years. Once again things are about to change, as I will be moving out of my current apartment at the end of May. Anna will be leaving Romania on the 10th May and another family of three will take her place. For my remaining time until August 9th, I will be staying (when I'm in Timisoara) with another great friend, Lynn. However with so many things happening this will equal to less than a month in between the camps and missions etc. This being the case, sadly, I am already starting to say farewells to people, as I don't know if there will be further opportunities to meet up with them.

I would like to mention and ask for your prayers as I have now put in my <u>application</u> to study at the Sydney Missionary and Bible College for 2011-12. This will mean that I will have a few months after I arrive back (around the end of September) for catching up with people back home. I would like to request now that you please allow me a few weeks to readjust and ease back into life in Australia, rather than requesting to meet up with me straight away. I would love to meet up with everyone of you personally if I can, but please allow me that initial space.

A second prayer point is that I will be looking for a <u>car</u> upon my return as, unfortunately, I received news two weeks ago that my car was written off in an accident. So if you know of or hear anything, I would appreciate hearing from you.

With world travel up in the air (or not), and my plans changing too, please disregard my address below after the end of May and don't send anything further by post.

With all my comings and goings over the next few months, I apologise in advance, if I do not respond to any of your emails or messages straight away. I will do my best. And, on a good note, I hope to get one more newsletter out to you before I leave for Germany Mission on the 18th June.


