A quarter of the way through the year already and life seems to be inundated with hard work, but mixed with joy. With little time to process everything that has already happened I will try to encapsulate what has happened since Christmas.

Just two days after Christmas, Angkor Wat! One highlight for me, aside from Deb (a fellow student) and I embarked on the beginning of a most special encounter as we shared in the lives of those in Phnom Penh and Siem Reap in Cambodia. A relatively new experience for me to work in an Asian culture; their friendly and welcoming demeanour was all encompassing.

Faced with the reality of their everyday circumstances, you only had walk around the corner to witness the poverty, corruptness and tell-tale signs of a country in need of healing, forgiveness, freedom from fear and the love of a Saviour.

When the rest of the team arrived on 7th January, we joined the International Teams missionaries in Siem Reap for an eye-opening three weeks into their lives and ministry. Working alongside them provided a great deal of mutual encouragement as we shared in the struggles and joys of what it means to work at the student centre and with the families in the villages.

It was wonderful to see our young Aussie team engage with enthusiasm and be

leading the team with all its highs and lows; was to witness the flow of emotion that came from one of the ladies who was sitting behind the children as I gave my talk about 'Jesus as King'. As she absorbed what was being translated into Khmer, she began to well up. I finished talking, before asking Tet (a Filipino missionary) who was consoling her, only to hear that this lady wanted Jesus to be her King. I was once again awestruck that God could use the simple message I had prepared for the village children, to touch the heart of this mother. It reminded me again, that all over this world, the harvest is ready- hearts are hungry to hear the truth, but the workers are few. And at the same time, when God is at work, nothing can stand in His way.
